What is the key to building trust:


- Understand that the iRAP Protocol is a very powerful tool, but has its limits


3.6: By 2020, halve the number of global deaths and injuries from road traffic crashes

A new UN Road Safety Fund?

In April 2016, the UN General Assembly requested the UN Secretary General to explore the possibility to establish a new UN Road safety Fund

A proposal has been put forward estimating that the additional grant funding for road safety needed to achieve the SDG road safety targets is \$770 million annually over the next decade.


Development of infrastructure safety rating tools and **Implementation of Road Assessment Programs** have been included as examples of interventions that the new Fund could support.

The consultation process on the Fund is still open. In an optimistic scenario the new Fund could be approved in April 2018
